French bank holidays differ to those in the UK. Contrary to the UK when a bank holiday falls on the weekend, it is not pushed forward to the Monday. However, when a bank holiday falls on a Tuesday or a Thursday, French workers often like to take the Monday or Friday off and in doing so create a 4 day weekend. This practice is known as the art 'faire le pont' or 'making a bridge'. When the bank holiday falls on a Wednesday and if a worker takes off either Monday and Tuesday or Thursday and Friday. this is known as 'faire le viaduc' or

Thursday and Friday, this is known as 'faire le viaduc' or 'doing a viaduct'.

In France, some school holidays are staggered over several weeks. The departement of the Vienne is in zone A and the department of Indre et Loire is in zone B. It is essential to bear this mind when planning holidays.
